On Sunday, November 8, 2009, Hurricane Ida swept El Salvador causing severe flooding and landslides that left over 150 dead, more than 60 disappeared, and over 14,000 displaced and homeless. The Division of Civil Protection of El Salvador has reported that 24 bridges and over 50 miles of roads and highways were destroyed. The Ministry of Agriculture has reported damage of numerous crops of beans, sugar cane, coffee and corn throughout the country. According to the Salvadoran Treasury, an estimated \$1 billion is needed for the reconstruction and relief for affected families.

A coalition of community organizations in the Washington Metropolitan Area have established the

Hurricane Ida Emergency Fund

and launched a campaign to collect funds for the victims of the hurricane and the reconstruction of affected areas.
